*A good lay overview must clearly demonstrate how the research will lead to improve current interventions, find a prevention or find a cure for cerebral palsy. It also should broadly cover these areas:*

- Why are you doing the research? What is the motivation behind the research application? Why is this research needed?*
- State clearly the aims and objectives of the research for a lay audience. What do you hope to find?*
- Describe clearly what you are going to do throughout the project to achieve your aims. Scientific detail isn't necessary, but the major steps in your research project should be mentioned. You should also mention the timeline for your project.*
- Explain how achieving your research aims could benefit people with or at risk of cerebral palsy.*
